

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Improving Quality In Physiological diagnostic Services:

Sponsored by the Chief Scientific Officer, the programme is hosted by the Royal College of Physicians (RCP). The 26 standards are developed and owned by the professionals and accreditation is managed by the United Kingdom Accreditation Service (UKAS)

Self Assessment and Improvement Tool (SAIT)


The self assessment element has measures that have been assigned levels D-A. Level B is typically the accreditation level. There is a reporting functionality and service can develop an action plan for improvement.

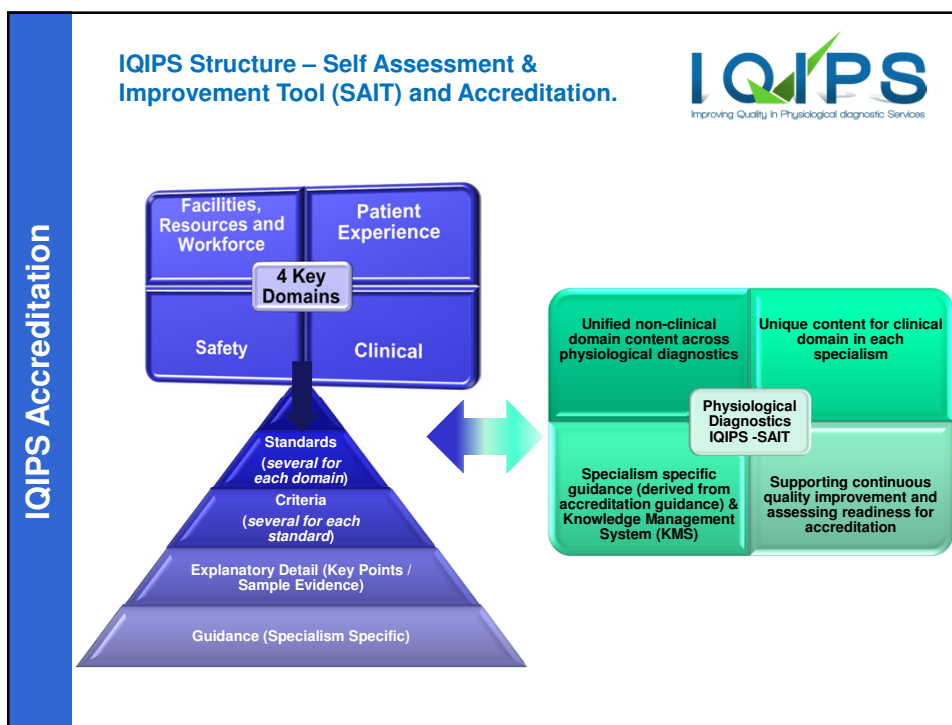
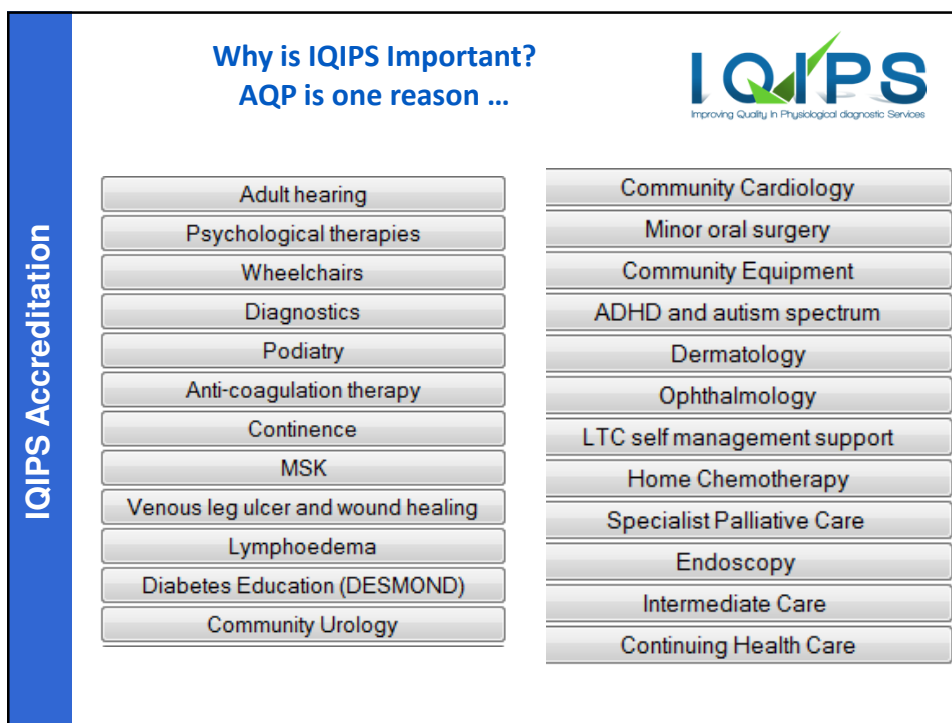
Accreditation

UKAS accreditation is a four year cycle involving external peer assessment to accurately assess the level of performance in relation to the established professionally developed standard

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The standards

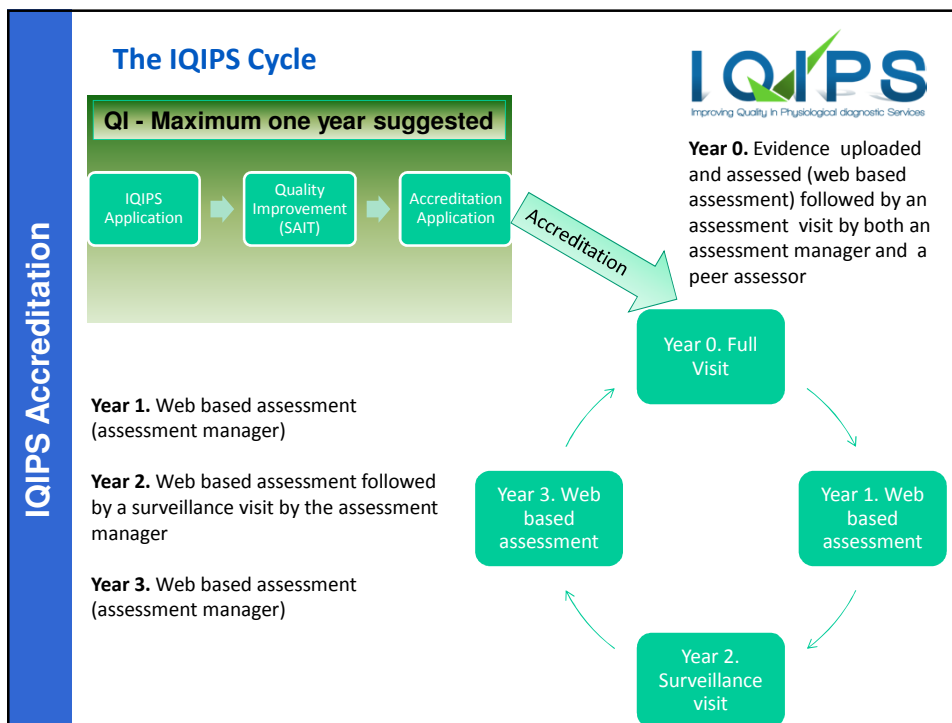



- Development began late 2009 (based on ISAS standards)
- Specialism specific working groups and the cross-discipline Accreditation Clinical Advisory Group (ACAG) were formed
- Grounded in evidence and outcome based standards and material were drafted by ACAG and the working groups
- The material was piloted
- A public consultation has been carried out

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The Importance of Audit



- Systems in place to ensure clinically relevant information is received from referrers and patients (CL1 C4)**
 - Audit of instances where incomplete referral information is received, and actions taken to improve referral quality, should be documented.
- Systems in place to assure the quality and accuracy of the interpretation and reporting of test results (CL3 C4)**
 - The reporting protocol will include regular audit and peer review of diagnosis and interpretation.
- Systems in place to ensure regular audit of current clinical practice, review and dissemination of findings and appropriate action (CL8 C2)**
- Systems in place to ensure governance arrangements to support introduction and audit of new clinical practices (CL8 C4)**
- SIP to ensure results of patient feedback are collated, analysed and findings are disseminated to relevant parties and acted upon (PE5 C4)**
